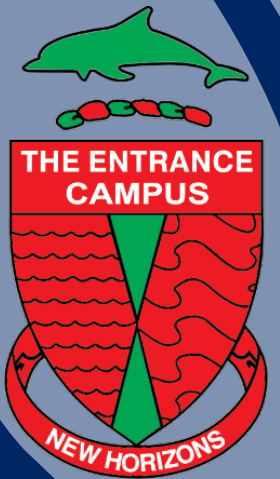

**Week 5:** Student and Parent course interviews (dates, times and location tbc)

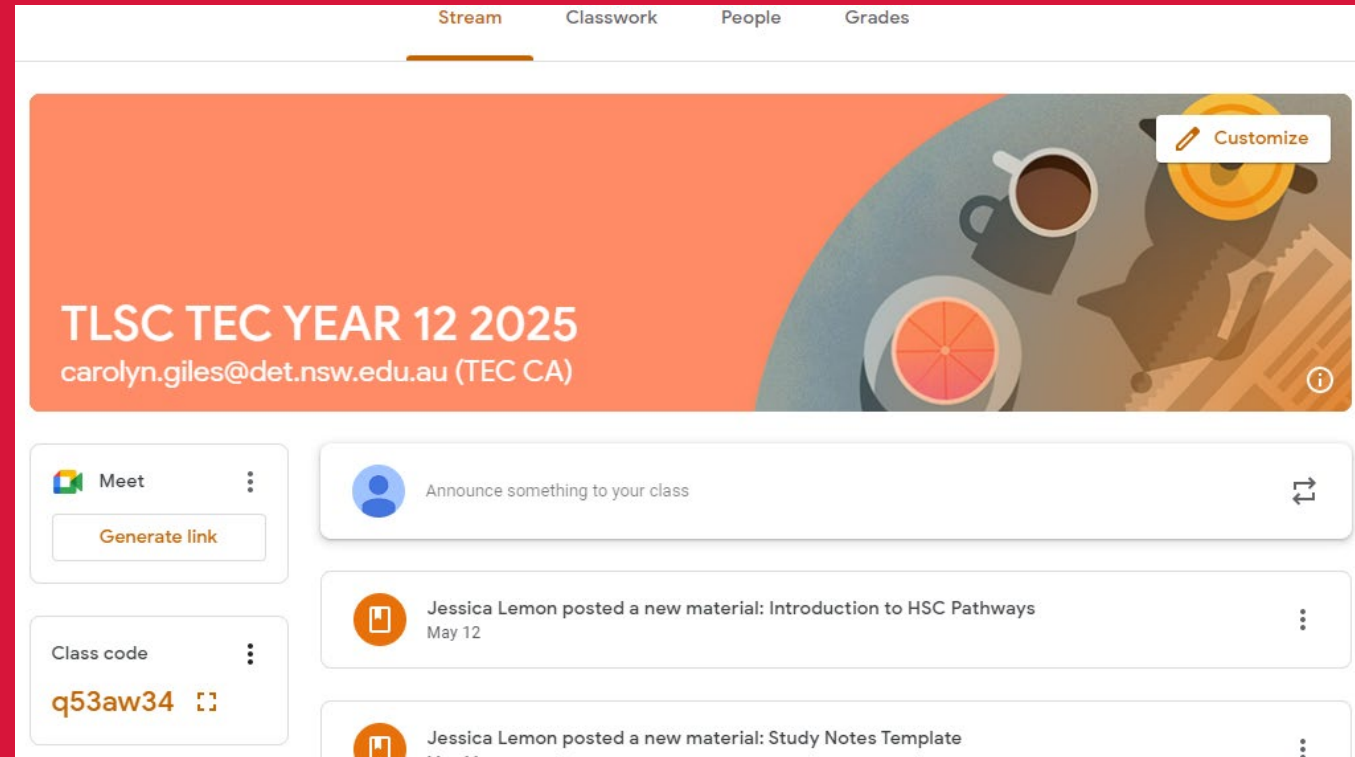
